You may notice that we are running seven weeks of summer camp instead of our usual eight. At this time, the Alameda Unified School District has not set a start date for their 2012-2013 school year so we are ending on August 10 in anticipation of school starting at the end of August. If school begins after Labor Day, we may add a week of our Meyers Camp (for girls and boys) at the end of August to assist parents with their summer camp needs.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

To request financial assistance, please call Natalie Duarte at 510.521.1743 x 206 before you mail in your registration to discuss a deposit amount. A limited number of scholarships are available for Summer Camp so make your request as soon as possible. Financial assistance applies to regular camp time only (9am-4pm) and not to extended care (7-9am, 4-6pm).

REFUND POLICY

All requests for refunds must be submitted <u>in writing</u> (a note or an email) to the Program Director, Natalie Duarte, nduarte@girlsincislandcity.org, and must be received by **5:30pm on the Monday prior to the camp start date** (at least one week ahead). No refunds will be considered after that time. Girls Inc. will retain at least 50% of fees collected.

TRANSFER POLICY

All requests for transfers and changes must be submitted in writing (a note or an email) to the Program Director, Natalie Duarte. A \$25 fee will be charged per transaction for all transfers and changes. These will be honored as long as space is available. There are no transfers between campers.

EXTENDED CARE

As a convenience to families, we offer extended care for the two hours before and after camp. AM Extended Care is from 7:00-9:00am and PM Extended Care is from 4:00-6:00pm. Each session of extended care is \$35 per week, per session. Girls must be enrolled in camp and no drop-in care is available. Activities will include outside time, games, crafts and reading. A healthy snack will be provided for girls in PM Extended Care.

Girls can choose **one** buddy (friend) to be grouped with for the weeks that they attend camp. Buddies must be in the same grade group (1st & 2nd, 3rd & 4th, or 5th & 6th) in order to be paired together.

PAYMENT INFORMATION

At least 50% of the total fees are due with the registration packet. The remaining balance must be paid by **Wednesday**, **June 6**, **2012 by 6:30pm**. If the balance is not paid by this time, your girl cannot attend and no refund will be given. <u>All fees</u> must be paid before your daughter attends camp.

We are now accepting credit card payments. Since we are assessed a fee for each credit card transaction and in an effort to keep the cost of camp as low as possible, we must pass on the transaction fee to the payee. All credit card payments will be assessed a fee of 3.1% of the transaction amount.

Make checks or money orders payable to Girls Inc. Do <u>not</u> send cash through the mail. Please make one payment per girl. **Returned check fee** is \$20.

Registration after June 1 must pay in full. No exceptions

CONFIRMATION

For those who register between March 26 - April 13, a confirmation will be sent to your home address by the beginning of May. For those who register after this period, confirmations will be sent as registration packets are processed.

FIELD TRIP POLICY

All field trips, local and major, are included in the camp price and girls must attend field trips with their group. No on-site supervision will be provided for girls to stay behind. Girls depart field trips with Girls Inc. and return with Girls Inc. They are not allowed to be dropped off or picked up at the field trip site or before they return to Girls Inc.

Girls Inc. t-shirts and sturdy shoes are required to be worn on all field trips. One t-shirt per new girl will be provided at the beginning of summer camp.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

For the initial round of registration, completed registration packets must be mailed to Girls Inc. and postmarked <u>starting</u> Monday, March 26 through Friday, April 13, 2012. Only mail-in registration will be taken during this time- forms cannot be dropped off at Girls Inc. Registration packets will be processed according to the postmark date on a first come, first-served basis. Any packets (a) received outside of the dates mentioned above, (b) those that don't go through the US postal system, (c) incomplete forms, or (d) without correct deposit amount will be held and processed after those with correct postmark dates, completed forms & correct deposit amounts.

To register, <u>completely</u> fill out the registration packet (middle two pages of this brochure) and mail with payment to: Girls Inc., 1724 Santa Clara Ave, Alameda, CA 94501. Registration checklist:

A \$10 charge will be assessed for incomplete forms, so please fill out all forms carefully! Please call Natalie Duarte at 510-521-1743 ext. 206 for any assistance needed filling out these forms.

In-Person Registration after April 13: Every Thursday <u>beginning</u> <u>April 26</u>, in-person registration will be taken from 5:00-6:00pm at Girls Inc. (1724 Santa Clara Ave) until May 31 or until space is filled.

Mail-In Registration after April 13: Mail-in will still be taken during this time but priority is given to in-person registration. The last day for mail-in registration is Friday, May 25, 2012.

Registration after June 1 will be taken by appointment only until space is filled. Call 510.521.1743 x 206 to make an appointment.

Registration after June 1 must pay in full. No exceptions.


