2017- 2018 ANNUAL REPORT



We spent a lot of time doing our homework in 2017-18 at Girls Inc. of the Island City. It was a big year for us to take another look at our community's needs to determine how we can best serve Alameda's girls.

In some ways, we were able to immediately support our girls: by taking teens to the Watermark Conference for Women; piloting a revised version of the popular sports curriculum GoGirlGo; expanding our elementary summer camp enrollment to serve more girls each week; and assisting teens in scholarship writing which led to two of our teens winning \$5000 Girls Inc. National Scholarships.

In other ways, we joined a few of our school district's committees and attended community meetings to gain a deeper understanding about what new issues our girls feel they are facing and additionally, the ways we can address those needs. Our homework paid off in a variety of ways and we are looking forward to creating a new program partnership with our local school district, Alameda Unified, as well as determining additional ways to support the City of Alameda.

At Girls Inc. of the Island City, we are very proud of our partnerships in the community and we are always ready to answer Alameda's call to support our girls. We could not do this work without our fantastic partners and supporters, and we are thankful for all that you do to support Girls Inc. of the Island City.

Best Foot Forward



Girls, ages 6 to 12, develop self-reliance and life skills by participating in a multi-workshop program that teaches them interview skills, script writing, public speaking, and professional etiquette. They then apply the skills they learn in the workshops by interacting with the women and teens who receive the **Women Who Dare** awards. The girls meet and interview all of the awardees, explore a large range of career paths, learn the real-life stories of women who impact the community, and meet new role models. At the Women Who Dare awards ceremony, the girls co-host the event, network with guests, and present the awards to the awardees.

Economic Literacy



We believe that it is never too soon to introduce girls to concepts that will help make them financially independent. Fifth graders participated in our Girls Inc. National

Economic Literacy Program where they were introduced to economic and business concepts that helped them start their own mock business. The girls learned about supply and demand, pricing, the differences between goods and services, what it means to be an entrepreneur, and the reasons people have for starting their own business. They formed partnerships and developed detailed business plans of their own. One of the highlights was designing logos for their new endeavors.

Girls participated in **GoGirlGo!**, an award-winning curriculum and sports education program from **The Women's Sports Foundation** that focuses on improving the social and emotional health and well-being of girls by combining sports and physical activity, leadership, and education. The material helps the girls understand social pressures and teaches them how to make healthy choices for their body and mind. The program also introduces them to powerful female athletes and their inspirational stories including Billie Jean King, founder of The Women's Sports Foundation.



Healthy Chefs

Promoting good health is a key component of our mission to inspire girls to be **strong**, **smart**, **and bold**. Healthy Chefs, one of our popular programs that focuses on building strong girls, teaches the importance of healthy eating and living well-balanced lives. Girls learned the basics of good eating habits and prepared delicious and nutritious recipes.

Eureka! STEM Teen Achievement Program

One of our most popular and award-winning programs, **Eureka!** spans over five years of a teen's life and is aimed at encouraging her to explore educational and career paths in **STEM** while providing personal and professional development activities. During the first two summers, teens spend four weeks participating in hands-on activities in math, science, technology, sports, and personal and professional development. For their third summer, girls participate in a four week paid internship in various career fields hosted by successful women participants. During the 4th and 5th summers, teens continue to be engaged in **STEM** field career exploration and college preparation.











Ethical Fashion Show 2018



Our annual **Ethical Fashion Show** is a design competition that promotes zero-waste practices by showcasing outfits made from upcycled materials. Teen designers and models spend six weeks in intensive, hands-on workshops in design, patterning, sewing, finishing, and modeling. The teens are mentored and the the show is judged by industry professionals.

National Scholarship Winners

We were proud to have two GIIC participants named **Girls Inc. National Scholars**. Along with this prestigious honor, the teens each received a \$5,000 scholarship.





Passport to Success

Passport to Success is an eight month series of themed workshop sessions that empower teens by promoting college readiness, self-sufficiency, leadership skills, personal safety, and positive decision making.

Alameda Island Kids



In 1981, at the request of the Alameda Unified School District, the Activity Center opened as a licensed child care service for families on school sites. Once again, Girls Inc. of the Island City responded to the needs of the community by providing a safe place for children during afterschool hours. In 2006, this program was renamed "Alameda Island Kids." It currently serves 326 children at Bay Farm, Earhart, Edison, Franklin, and Otis Elementary Schools. Alameda Island Kids beforeschool and after-school services are specially designed to provide age appropriate daily activities including organized games and sports, cooking experiences, science, dramatic play, arts and crafts, and much more. Activities are designed to develop social skills and build confidence.
